Rabbi Daniel Stein is a Rosh Yeshiva at the Rabbi Isaac Elchanan Theological Seminary (RIETS), where he holds the Perez and Frieda Friedberg Chair in Talmud and is the director of the Norman and Johanne Sternthal Fourth Year Halachah Lemaaseh Program. He also serves as Rav at Congregation Ahavath Chesed, known as the Ridniker Shteibel, on Manhattan's Upper West Side. Prior to that, he was the founding rabbi at Congregation Beis Sholom in Clifton, New Jersey. In addition, Rabbi Stein is a contributor to TorahWeb.org, and a noted expert in the laws of eruvin. He has been consulted regarding the creation, extension, and maintenance of numerous eruvin in the United States and Australia.

Rabbi Stein is an alumnus of Yeshivas Ohr Yerushalayim and received his ordination from the Rabbi Isaac Elchanan Theological Seminary where he studied for 11 years and was a fellow of the Bella and Harry Wexner Kollel Elyon. At RIETS, Rabbi Stein delivers a daily Gemara Shiur to undergraduate students and teaches halacha to semichah talmidim after which he tests them for ordination. Rabbi Stein's shiurim and derashos appeal to a broad audience and address a wide range of topics. Rabbi Stein, and his wife Gila, who is the Chair of the Science and STEM Departments at Maayanot Yeshiva High School for Girls in Teaneck NJ, have four children, Elchonon, Yocheved, Adina, and Michael, and they split their time between Clifton NJ and Manhattan.
